New! Receive *The Penn Township Pipeline* By E-Mail

While it is with sadness that this is the first issue of *The Penn Township Pipeline* that is not being printed and mailed to residents due to budget cuts, we are happy to announce that you can now make sure you continue to receive each issue as it is published via e-mail.



As explained in the last issue, to balance the township budget without a tax increase, one of the cuts needed to be this newsletter. The costs to print and mail *The Penn Township Pipeline* have increased over the years.

If you'd like to place yourself on the mailing, visit the township web site at www.penntwp.org. On the home page, you will find a form that you can complete to subscribe or unsubscribe from the mailing list at any time.

If you'd rather not be on the mailing list, but would like to view the issues, you can always access them from the township web site. The current issue is always available from the navigation section on the left side of each page. Previous issues are archived. Click on the Contacts link on the left side of any page, and then click on Communications. There you will find the issues dating back to Winter 2002.

The production schedule for *The Penn Township Pipeline* remains the same. Four issues will be produced that correspond to the seasons.

For example, the next issue, the summer issue, will be online around the start of summer, June 20, with the deadline for contributions being June 2.

Each issue covers the next three full months. So, the summer issue, coming out around June 20, will cover the months of July, August and September.

The winter issue will be out around December 20, with a deadline of December 1, and will cover January, February and March.

Then, we will be back to the spring issue which will be out around March 20, with a deadline of March 1, and will cover April, May and June.

From the Township Tax Collector

2008 County/Municipal Real Estate Taxes

The Westmoreland County and Penn Township real estate tax statements, as well as the street light assessment statements, for the year 2008 were mailed in late February.

Property owners who have not received their tax statements should call the Penn Township real estate tax office at 724-744-1414. Also, please call if you believe that you received a tax statement in error, (e.g., it should have been sent to your mortgage company).

April 30, 2008 is the last day for property owners to pay the Westmoreland County and Penn Township real estate tax at the 2% discount amount. Payments postmarked after 4/30/2007 through 6/30/2007 will be accepted at the face amount. Payments postmarked after 6/30/2007 through 12/31/2007 are subject to a 10% penalty.

Penn Township street light assessment payments are due at the face amount by 4/30/2008. Payments postmarked 5/1/2008 through 12/31/2008 will be accepted at the 5% penalty amount.

Real estate tax payments should be made to Larry Wojcik, the Penn Township Tax Collector and Treasurer, who is located in the municipal building located at 2001 Municipal Court, Harrison City, PA 15636.

His phone number is 724-744-1414, and normal business hours are Monday - Thursday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

2008 LST Taxes

The Local Service Tax (LST), formerly the EMS (Emergency and Municipal Services), tax forms were sent out the first week of March. The first quarter payments are due by April 30, 2008.

All persons who are employed or self-employed, including both resident and non-resident individuals, eighteen years of age or older as of January 1, 2008, engaging in an occupation within Penn Township are liable for this tax. A refund can be given at the end of the year if the employed has income from all sources less than \$12,000.

Self-employed individuals that have not received their LST tax form should contact the tax office at 724-744-1414.

Important Note: *If you have a business and have not paid your LST tax*, you are required by township ordinance to pay this \$52 tax. This includes all self-employed individuals!

The CLC, which operates solely with donations and volunteers, has also helped needy people from more than 70 area agencies including The Red Cross, St. Vincent DePaul Center, the Blackburn Center Against Domestic and Sexual Violence, Salvation Army, and the Westmoreland Case Management and Supports, Inc.

Donations are also accepted year-round at the CLC Thrift Store on 258 East Pittsburgh Street, Greensburg, from 10 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., at the rear of the building.
