Clean Out and Recycle

Westmoreland Cleanways will be hosting several recycling events in the area this spring.

Hard-to-Recycle Items

On Saturday, May 7, you can recycle those hard to recycle items like electronics, vehicle batteries, tires, and appliances at Carmike Cinemas Wynnsong Theater in Delmont from 8:30 am – noon. Once collected, as much of the material as possible is recycled.

Non-Freon containing appliances, electronics, and vehicle (lead acid) batteries may be recycled for free.

Fees for recycling tires and Freon-containing appliances are minimal. It's just \$1.75 per tire off-rim and \$2.75 per tire on-rim for automotive and light truck tires. Fees for tractor tires and tractor trailer tires are higher. It's just \$20 to tag and recycle Freon-containing appliances.

Prescription Drugs

On Saturday, April 30, the Drug Enforcement Administration will hold a Prescription Drug Take Back Day and Westmorland Cleanways is participating. There will be various locations around the county where you can take your expired prescriptions and over-the-counter drugs (pills only) to be disposed of properly. Two confirmed locations are Murrysville Library and the North Huntingdon Police Department. Both collections will take place from 10 am - 2 pm. Backyard Composting

Learn to recycle your yard waste and kitchen scraps into valuable compost at one of Westmoreland Cleanways backyard composting workshops to be held this spring. On Saturday, May 14, a workshop will be held at Oak Hollow Park in North Huntingdon, and on Saturday, May 21, one will be held at Valley Landfill in Penn Township. The time for both workshops is 9 am to 11:30 am, with the cost of the workshop of \$10 per person, payable at the door. Pre-registration is required no later than one week before the workshop date. From the Township Tax Collector

2011 Westmoreland County/ Penn Township Real Estate Taxes

The Westmoreland County and Penn Township real estate tax statements, as well as the street light assessment statements, for the year 2011 were mailed in late February.

Property owners who have not received their tax statements should call the Penn Township real estate tax office at 724-744-1414.

April 30, 2011 is the last day for property owners to pay the Westmoreland County and Penn Township real estate tax at the 2% discount amount. Payments postmarked after 4/30/2011 through 6/30/2011 will be accepted at the face amount. Payments postmarked after 6/30/2011 through 12/31/2011 are subject to a 10% penalty.

Penn Township street light assessment payments are due at the face amount by 4/30/2011. Payments postmarked 5/1/2011 through 12/31/2011 will be accepted at the 5% penalty amount.

Real estate tax payments should be made to Larry Wojcik, the Penn Township Tax Collector and Treasurer, who is located in the municipal building located at 2001 Municipal Court, Harrison City, PA 15636.

His phone number is 724-744-1414, and normal business hours are Monday - Thursday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

2011 LST Taxes

The Local Service Tax (LST), formerly the EMS (Emergency and Municipal Services), tax forms were sent out the first week of March. The first quarter payments are due by April 30, 2011.

All persons who are employed or self-employed, including both resident and non-resident individuals, eighteen years of age or older as of January 1, 2011, engaging in an occupation within Penn Township are liable for this tax. A refund can be given at the end of the year if the employed has earned income of less than \$12,000.

Self-employed individuals that have not received their LST tax form should contact the tax office at 724-744-1414. Important Note: If

you have a business and have not paid your LST tax, you are required by township ordinance to pay this \$52 tax. This includes all self-employed individuals!

May 7 – Hard-to-Recycle Event

Westmoreland Cleanways sponsors collections every spring and fall for those "hard to dispose of" items that include tires, vehicle (lead acid) batteries, appliances (including Freon containing), scrap metal, and electronics. Once collected, as much of the material as possible is recycled. On Saturday, May 7, the collection will be held at the Carmike Cinemas Wynnsong Theater in Delmont from 8:30 am - noon.

The fee to recycle automotive and light truck tires is \$1.75 per tire off-rim and \$2.75 per tire on-rim. (fees for tractor tires and tractor trailer tires are higher). Freon-containing appliances have a fee of \$20 for tagging and disposal, but all other items/appliances for scrap metal and vehicle batteries may be turned in free of charge.

June 9 - Penn-Trafford School District Physical Exams for Student Athletes

Physical exams for student athletes in the Penn-Trafford School District will be conducted on June 9, 2011.

To receive a physical exam from the district's physicians, you will need to be present on this scheduled day at the high school. The physicals will begin at 7 a.m. and will follow the schedule listed according to grade level and time. This free physical exam is offered in conjunction with an orthopedic screening of every athlete. The screening is a necessary and important component of the exam. It detects abnormalities and conditions that might predispose an athlete to injury and helps provide the best possible health care to the school district's student athletes.

This is the third year for the new physical forms adopted by the PIAA and Penn-Trafford School District. Please note that all physicals need to be completed after June 1, 2011 to be valid for the 2011-2012 school year. No copies are allowed and doctors' offices DO NOT have the necessary forms. Forms must be completed in ink; do not use pencil.

Follow the timeline below for turning in the forms.

May 2, 2011: Physical forms will be available in the main office of Penn-Trafford High School, Penn Middle School, Trafford Middle School, and the Athletic Training Room at the high school. Parents must complete and sign the medical history forms prior to the school physical date. **DO NOT REMOVE ANY PAGES OF THE FORM.**

May 19, 2011: Deadline for students to have the medical history sections of the packet completed and turned in to the nurses' offices at Penn-Trafford High School, Trafford Middle School, or Penn Middle School to be eligible for the FREE physical exam and orthopedic screen at Penn-Trafford High School on June 9, 2011. Forms that are not complete will be returned to the students or parents.

June 9, 2011: Pre-participation physical exam and orthopedic screen at Penn Trafford High School.

Art Classes: The Penn Area Library's "Intro to Art" sessions were so popular last year that they are bringing instructor, Cindy Gainor, back again to lead another workshop. In this new series on drawing, Cindy will introduce methods and projects for participants at beginner and more advanced levels. Penn Area Library Summer Reading Program: The theme this summer is "One World Many Stories.", and participants will be reading lots of tales from around the world and learning fascinating facts about other cultures. Be sure to join the fun.

Registration starts Tuesday, May 31 and the program runs through Saturday, July 23rd. The end of summer reading party is scheduled for Wednesday, July 27th at the library. Participants must come into the library to register and can

begin reading and recording at that time. First completed logs will be accepted on Monday, June 13th or after.

The program is open to all children who have a Penn Area Library card (or whose parents have a card), and there are three age groups: the Read to Me Club for children through age 7, the Summer Reading Club for children ages 8 through 12, and the Teen Reading Club for teens ages 13 through 16.



Those children, who are in the Read to Me Club, will have the titles of the books someone reads to them recorded on a reading log. They will receive 5 raffle tickets for every completed log of 15 books read and a raffle ticket for every visit they make to the library during the six week program.

Children, in the Summer Reading Club and Teen Reading Club, will keep a log of the hours they read. They will receive 5 raffle tickets for every completed log of 5 hours they read as well as a raffle ticket for every visit they make to the library during the program. Participants can turn in their raffle tickets at any time with their name, their phone number, and the number of the prize they want to win. Over 150 prizes will be on display in the library.

Family Story hour will be held throughout the summer reading program on Thursdays. There will be two sessions, 10 am and 11 am for all ages. Sign-up sheets will be posted one week in advance of each story time.

There also will be events throughout the summer reflecting the program's theme.

The events will be held in the library's multi-purpose room unless otherwise noted. Sign-up sheets will be posted in the library one week before each event.
