From the Township Tax Collector

2008 County/Municipal Real Estate Taxes

The last day for property owners to pay the Westmoreland County and Penn Township real estate tax at the face amount is June 30, 2008.

Payments postmarked after June 30 and through December 31, 2008 will be accepted at the 10% penalty amount.

Real estate tax payments should be made to Larry Wojcik, the Penn Township Tax Collector and Treasurer, who is located in the municipal building located at 2001 Municipal Court, Harrison City, PA 15636.

His phone number is 724-744-1414, and normal business hours are Monday - Thursday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

2008 School Real Estate Taxes

The Penn-Trafford real estate tax notices will be mailed around August 1, 2008. Homeowners and businesses that have not received their tax statements within seven working days from that date should call Larry Wojcik at the Penn Township tax office at 724-744-1414. In addition, please call the tax office if you believe that you received a tax statement in error, (e.g., it should have been sent to your mortgage company).

The 2% discount period is from August 1, 2008, through September 30, 2008. Payments postmarked after September 30, 2008 through November 30, 2008 will be accepted at the face amount.

Street Light Assessments

Payments for the Penn Township street light assessment statements are now due through December 31, 2008 at the 5% penalty amount.

2008 Local Services Tax

The second quarter payments for the Local Services Tax (LST), formerly the EMS tax, for the year 2008 are due by July 31, 2008.

All persons who are employed or self-employed, including both resident and non-resident individuals, eighteen years of age or older as of January 1, 2008, engaging in an occupation within Penn Township are liable for this tax. A refund can be given at the end of the year if the

individual has income from all sources less than \$12,000.

Self-employed individuals that have not received their LST tax form should contact the tax office at 724-744-1414. You are required by township ordinance to pay this \$52 tax.

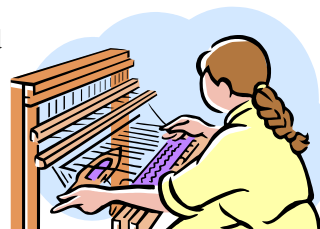

Summer Reading Program Underway: Summer is always an extremely busy time in the library! Registration for the Summer Reading program began on June 2 and will conclude on Saturday, July 19. All logs must be turned in by July 26. This year's theme is "Catch the Reading Bug." Children may sign-up in one of three clubs: Read-to-Me (for those not able to read themselves); Summer Reading Club for those age twelve and under; and Teen Reading Club for those over thirteen and not over eighteen years of age. After they have signed up for the program, children receive one raffle ticket for each library visit. For each five hours they read or for fifteen books that have been read to them, the child receives five tickets. Participants then place the tickets into the cans in the children's area corresponding to prizes in the showcases. There are at least 150 prizes and, during the program, there will be contests for additional prizes. Winners for the main prizes will be announced before the summer end party.

Each week, programs are held on Mondays and Wednesdays, and two storytimes are held on Thursdays.

You must come into the library to sign-up for the Summer Reading Program, but once signed up, you may phone the library to sign-up for programs. Sign-ups are usually in the library at least one week before the program date. A calendar of the programs is available on the library web site, www.pennlib.org. The final

party will be held on July 30 from 12:00 noon until 3:00 p.m.
