From the Township

Snow Reminders

The township staff would like you to keep these items in mind as we head through another winter snow season.



First, remember to keep roads accessible to snow plows. When snow is predicted, please park your vehicles in your garage or driveway. An unobstructed road means a clearer road.

Second, snow can cause problems for firefighters when the hydrants become difficult to access. Please help by pitching in and removing snow from around area fire hydrants.

Third, please do not shovel snow into the roadways. It is a violation to do so.

Fourth, please make sure your mailbox post is secure. A secure post helps avoid delays in mail delivery caused by hidden mailboxes.

From the Township Tax Collector

2011 School Real Estate Taxes

All real estate taxes for the current tax year 2011 are required to be paid by 12/31/2011.

All payments made after 12/31/2011 must be made at the Westmoreland County Courthouse's Tax Claim Bureau.

2011 Local Services Taxes

The fourth quarter payments for the Local Services Tax (LST) for the year 2011 are due by 1/31/2012. All persons who are employed or self-employed, including both resident and non-resident individuals, eighteen years of age or older as of January 1, 2011, engaging in an occupation within Penn Township are liable for this tax.

A refund can be given at the end of the year if the employed has income from all sources less than \$12,000.

Self employed individuals that have not received their Local Services tax form should contact the tax office at 724-744-1414.

Important Note: If you have a business and have not paid your LST, you are required by township ordinance to pay this \$52 tax. This includes all self-employed individuals!

2012 Westmoreland County/ Penn Township Real Estate Taxes

The Westmoreland County and Penn Township real estate tax statements and street light assessment statements for the year 2012 are scheduled to be mailed by 3/1/2012.

Property owners who don't receive their tax statements within 7 days of this date should call the Penn Township real estate tax office, 724-744-1414.

Also, call if you believe that you received a tax statement in error (e.g., it should have been sent to your mortgage company).

The Twelve Sites of Social Security

During the holiday season, it's hard to walk in a public place without hearing a Christmas carol or two. One of the most popular traditional songs is "The Twelve Days of Christmas." It's been a holiday favorite since it was published in 1780. Here's our take on the song: "The Twelve Sites of Social Security."

For the first site of Social Security, we present to you: our home page, www.socialsecurity.gov. It's the place to go for all things Social Security. Everything you could want — from online services and screening tools to publications and press releases — can be found easily from this starting place.

On the second site of Social Security, we present to you: an easy way to get or replace your Social Security card at www.socialsecurity.gov/ssnumber.

On the third site of Social Security, we present to you: an online application for retirement benefits that you can complete and submit in as little as 15 minutes at www.socialsecurity.gov/planners/about.htm.

Questions and Answers

Question: When a person who has worked and paid Social Security taxes dies, are benefits payable on that person's record?

Answer: Social Security survivors benefits can be paid to:

- A widow or widower — unreduced benefits at full retirement age, or reduced benefits as early as age 60;
- A disabled widow or widower — as early as age 50;
- A widow or widower at any age if he or she takes care of the deceased's child who is under age 16 or disabled, and receiving Social Security benefits;
- Unmarried children under 18, or up to age 19 if they are attending high school full time. Under certain circumstances, benefits can be paid to stepchildren, grandchildren or adopted children;
- Children at any age who were disabled before age 22 and remain disabled; and

- Dependent parents age 62 or older.

Even if you are divorced, you still may qualify for survivors benefits. For more information, go to www.socialsecurity.gov.

Question: I lost my Social Security card. Should I get a new one?

Answer: You may not need to get a replacement card. Knowing your Social Security number is what is important. However, you can replace your Social Security card for free if it is lost or stolen. Remember, you are limited to three replacement cards in a year and 10 during your lifetime. Learn more at www.socialsecurity.gov.



Question: Can I get an estimate of my retirement benefit at several different possible ages?

Answer: Yes. We suggest you use our Retirement Estimator at www.socialsecurity.gov/estimator to test different retirement scenarios. This online tool will give you retirement benefit estimates based on current law and real time access to your earnings record. The Retirement Estimator also lets you create additional "what if" retirement scenarios. It's even available in Spanish at www.segurosocial.gov/calculador. You can test even more alternatives at www.socialsecurity.gov/planners/calculators.htm.

Question: If both my spouse and I are entitled to Social Security benefits, is there any reduction in our payments because we are married?

Answer: No. We calculate lifetime earnings independently to determine each spouse's Social Security benefit amount. When each member of a married couple meets all other eligibility requirements to receive Social Security retirement benefits, each spouse receives a monthly benefit amount based on his or her own earnings. Couples are not penalized simply because they are married. If one member of the couple earned low wages or failed to earn enough Social Security credits (40) to be insured for retirement benefits, he or she may be eligible to receive benefits as a spouse. Question: I am receiving Social Security disability benefits. Will my benefits be affected if I work and earn money?

Answer: It can, depending on how much you make. We have special rules called "work incentives" that help you keep your cash benefits and Medicare while you test your ability to work. For example, there is a trial work period during which you can receive full benefits regardless of how much you earn, as long as you report your work activity and continue to have a disabling impairment. Question: Is there a time limit on Social Security disability benefits?

Answer: Your disability benefits will continue as long as your medical condition has not improved and you cannot work. We will review your case at regular intervals to make sure you are still disabled. Learn more by reading our publication, Disability Benefits, at www.socialsecurity.gov/pubs/10029.html.

Question: Is it true that a person can own a home and still be eligible for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits?

Answer: Yes, a person who owns a home and lives in that home can be eligible for SSI benefits. SSI is for people who are disabled, aged, or blind and who have limited income and resources. However, there are some items we do not count as resources, such as the home you live in. For more information, read our booklet, Supplemental Security Income, at www.socialsecurity.gov/pubs/11000.html.

Question: I know you need to have limited resources to receive Supplemental Security Income (SSI). But what is considered a resource?

Answer: Resources are things you own that you can use for support. They include cash, real estate, personal belongings, bank accounts, stocks, and bonds. To be eligible for SSI a person must have no more than \$2,000 in countable resources. A married couple must have no more than \$3,000 in countable resources. If you own resources over the SSI limit, you may be able to get SSI benefits while trying to sell the resources. Not all of your resources count toward the SSI resource limit. For example:

- The home you live in and the land it's on do not count.
- Your personal effects and household goods do not count.
- Life insurance policies may not count, depending on their value.
- Your car usually does not count.
- Burial plots for you and members of your immediate family do not count.
- Up to \$1,500 in burial funds for you and up to \$1,500 in burial funds for your spouse may not count.
- If you are blind or have a disability, some items may not count if you plan to use them to work or earn extra income.

Question: If I call 1-800-772-1213, can a Social Security representative take my application for Medicare prescription drug help over the phone?

Answer: If an interviewer is available when you call the 800 number, he or she can take your application over the phone. If an interviewer is not immediately available, we can schedule a telephone appointment for you. For the fastest and most convenient way to apply for Medicare prescription drug help, go online to www.socialsecurity.gov/prescriptionhelp.
