From the Township Police

Project ChildSafe Comes to Penn Township

The Penn Township Police Department will provide over 2,000 free firearm safety kits to local residents through a partnership with Project ChildSafe, the nationwide firearms safety education program. The safety kits, which include a gunlock, can be obtained in the lobby of the Penn Township Police Department located at 2000 Commercial Court (off of Sandy Hill Road).



Project ChildSafe, a program developed by the National Shooting Sports Foundation, will distribute millions of firearm safety kits throughout the country over the next year. The program is funded by a U.S. Department of Justice grant, with additional funding provided by the firearms industry.

The police department encourages residents to pick up a Project ChildSafe safety kit, so that they can securely store their firearm. Each kit contains a safety curriculum and a cable style gunlock. The lock fits on most types of handguns, rifles, and shotguns. The goal is to prevent a child or any other unauthorized person from accessing a firearm in your home.

In addition to the availability of the safety kits at the police department, officers are available to meet with community groups to provide a firearms safety program and distribute the safety kits. Traffic Safety Initiative to be Implemented

As this edition of the Pipeline goes to press, the Penn Township Police Department is working on a traffic safety awareness and education program. Modeled after Murrysville's PACE Car program, the police department is working to offer a similar type program to the residents of Penn Township.

Traffic complaints continue to be one of the most frequent complaints the police department receives. Obviously, there are not enough police officers to be on every street and at every intersection. This program will enable residents to do their part to help improve traffic safety within the township.

The police department believes that this program, in addition to strict enforcement of traffic laws by the officers, will have a positive impact on traffic concerns in the township. Residents will be notified in the local papers about the details of this traffic safety initiative in the near future.

Apply for the Citizen's Police Academy

The Penn Township Police Department is now accepting applications for the fifth class of the Penn Township Citizen's Police Academy, which will begin on Thursday, September 2, 2004 and continue for the next 12 Thursdays. A graduation ceremony will be held on Thursday, November 18, 2004.

The academy is open to all Penn Township residents 18 years of age and older. The first 25 applicants, five from each of the five township wards, will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis. Residents will be notified upon their acceptance.

Selected applicants will be required to pass a background check and sign a waiver of liability. Participants must attend 80% of the classes to graduate.

Applications can be picked up at the police station and will be available until the class is full.

From the Tax Collector

2004 Real Estate Taxes

The Westmoreland County and Penn Township real estate tax statements, as well as the street light assessment statements, for the year 2004 were mailed on February 28. Property owners who have not received their tax statements should call the Penn Township real estate tax office at 724-744-1414. Also, please call if you believe that you received a tax statement in error, (e.g., it should have been sent to your mortgage company).

April 30, 2004 is the last day for property owners to pay the Westmoreland County and

Penn Township real estate tax at the 2% discount amount. Payments postmarked after 4/30/2004 through 6/30/2004 will be accepted at the face amount. Payments postmarked after 6/30/2004 through 12/31/2004 are subject to a 10% penalty.

Penn Township street light assessment payments are due at the face amount by 4/30/2004. Payments postmarked 5/1/2004 through 12/31/2004 will be accepted at the 5% penalty amount.

2004 Occupational Privilege Taxes

The occupational privilege tax forms for 2004 have been mailed. The first quarter payments are due by 4/30/2004. All persons who are employed or self-employed, including both resident and non-resident individuals, engaging in an occupation within Penn Township and who have earnings of over \$10,000 are liable for this tax. Employers are required to withhold this tax from all employees regardless of their resident district.

Self-employed individuals or businesses that have not received their occupational privilege tax form should contact the tax office at 724-744-1414. This tax is jointly assessed by the Penn Township Commissioners and the Penn-Trafford School District at a rate of \$10.00 per year.

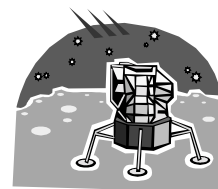
Penn Area Library

NASA Space Program Landing at the Penn Area Library

The library has been awarded a grant from the Association for Children's Service, the American Library Association, and NASA to host the program NASA@yourlibrary.

Coming in September, the program will include six iMAC computers, donated by the Apple Computer Corporation, and a plasma screen theatre. Patrons will be able to use the computers to learn about space. The plasma screen theatre will show a different show each week for four weeks.

Subjects will include communications, health, agriculture, and transportation.



Also included in this program is a grant for \$1,000 for collection development, which will be used to purchase material about space and science for all ages. The library will also be hosting a reception to introduce the exhibit to the patrons. All library staff will receive training, so that they can answer questions and help everyone enjoy the exhibit. Closer to September, more information will be available.

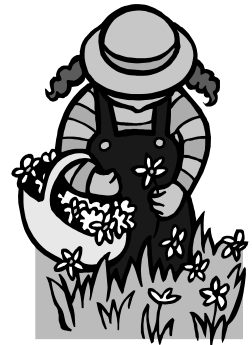
