### News from Our Police Department

#### Citizens Police Academy

On November 21, 2002, a graduation ceremony was held at the police department for the third class of the Penn Township Police Citizen Police Academy.

Since September 2001, seventy-one citizens have completed this course. The goal of the academy is to give citizens of Penn Township a realistic view of their police department and the officers' capabilities, education, and training. In addition, the academy has permitted these citizens and the police officers an opportunity to interact in a positive way.

Another academy class is being planned for September 2003. Applications will be available in the spring of 2003.

#### Terrorism Awareness and Prevention Program (TAPP)

Chief Michael Mastroianni and Sergeant John Simcoviak have been trained to present the Terrorism Awareness and Prevention Program (TAPP).

This program is taught by specially trained law enforcement officers to educate citizens about the realities and myths of terrorists and terrorism. The one-hour program helps citizens understand: the threat to our society; their part in protecting the community; and

common sense measures they can take to enhance their own security.


Chief Mastroianni and Sgt. Simcoviak are available to present this program to any citizen's group in the township. If your group is interested, call the police department at 724-863-1119 for details.

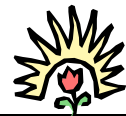


### Township Tax Information

#### 2002 Real Estate Taxes

Pennsylvania Act 169 of 1998 (Collection of Taxes-Effective 12/31/1999) requires all real estate taxes for the current tax year 2002 to

be paid by 12/31/2002. All payments made after 12/31/2002 must be made at the Westmoreland County Courthouse's Tax Claim Bureau.

Payments can be made by mail, in person at the tax collectors office during normal business hours, Monday through Thursday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., in person after hours via a drop-off slot at the tax collector's office, or online via the township web site.

### 2002 Occupational Privilege Taxes

The fourth quarter payments for the occupational privilege tax for the year 2002 are due by 1/31/2003.

All persons who are employed or self-employed, including both resident and non-resident individuals, engaging in an occupation within Penn Township who have earnings of over \$1,500.00 are liable for this tax. Employers are required to withhold this tax from all employees regardless of their resident district.

Self-employed individuals or businesses that have not received occupational privilege tax forms should contact the tax office. This tax is jointly assessed by the Penn Township Commissioners and the Penn-Trafford School District at a rate of \$10.00 per year.

### 2003 Real Estate Taxes

The Westmoreland County and Penn Township real estate tax statements and street light assessment statements for the year 2003 are scheduled to be mailed by 3/1/2003.

Property owners who don't receive their tax statements within 7 days of this date should call the Penn Township real estate tax office, 724-744-1414.

Also, call if you believe that you received a tax statement in error (e.g., it should have been sent to your mortgage company).

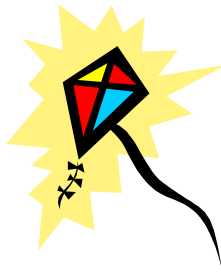

#### January 10 – Community Health Screening

Are you at risk for a stroke or abdominal aortic aneurysm and don't know it?

Fifty percent of victims show no warning signs before a stroke or aneurysm!

A community health screening will be held at St. Barbara's Church in Harrison City on Friday, January 10, 2003. All are welcome!

The screening will include four procedures.

- Abdominal aneurysm ultrasound (prevent an aortic aneurysm)
- Stroke prevention screening (doppler ultrasound of carotid artery)
- Peripheral arterial disease (early heart disease indicator)
- Bone density screening (detection for osteoporosis)

All tests painless and take just 10 minutes. The results are referred back to your own doctor.

The cost is \$40 per test. Appointments are limited and required. Call 1-800-643-6075 to schedule an appointment or for more information.

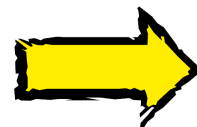
Dear Penn Township Resident:

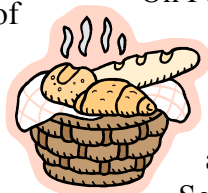
Penn Lutheran Church (Harrison Ave., Penn) will change their time of worship to 11:00 a.m. for the months of January, February, March, and April.
